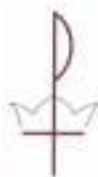

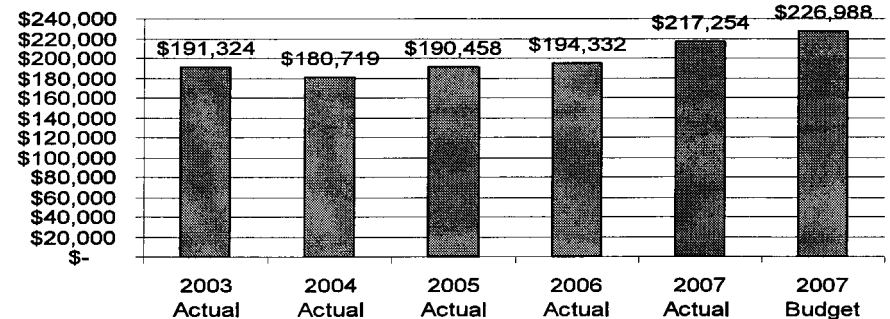

### Key Messages

- Giving is beginning to come back after the summer months. The 4th Quarter has always been strong and winter is coming!. Offerings are down by approx 4.3 % for the year.
- Net cash position (cash accounts less restricted giving) continues to be negative.
- 2007 expenses are coming back in line, only over budget by \$2,820 or 1.2%.

## **Pastor Keyl is leading a New England Synod Pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2008**

Bishop Payne has asked Pastor Keyl to lead a group in the Spring to visit companion congregations in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, to hear presenters who are working for peace with justice, and to understand

both the context and the geography of life in the Middle East. Included in this trip will be tours of Jerusalem and Bethlehem, celebrations of the Feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, and an excursion to Galilee.

Promotion for this trip, scheduled for April 29-May 13, 2008 has just begun. Total cost will be approximately \$3,000 (based on double occupancy), and space is limited. To hold your spot, a deposit of \$400 is required made out to the New England Synod, with the memo "Holy Land 2008 Pilgrimage."
