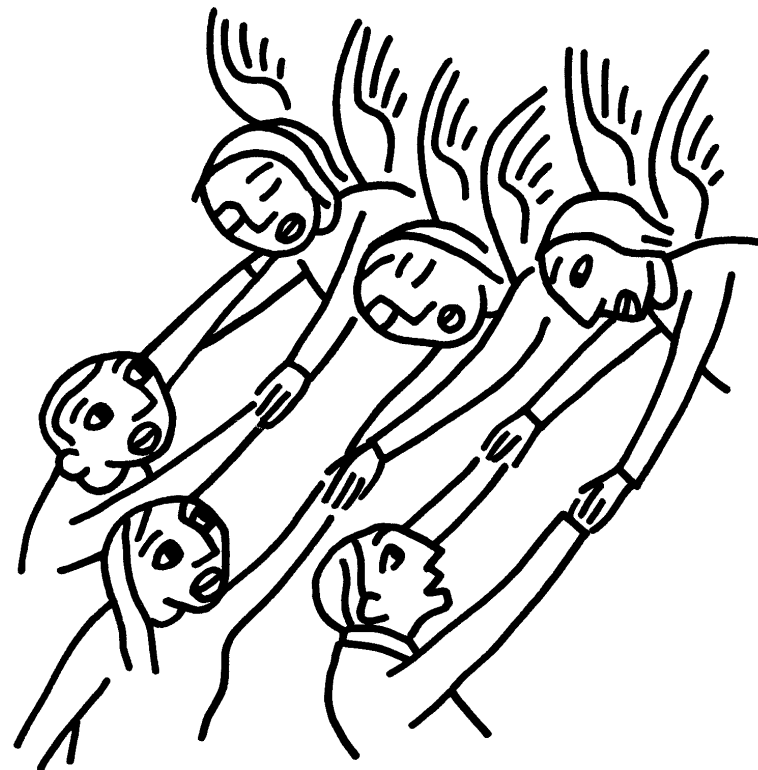

In these final weeks of the liturgical year, the church cries out, "Come, Lord Jesus!" We are always awaiting God's coming, and God does not disappoint us, making the divine presence known in water, bread, wine, and in this human community of faith.

The church celebrates two people of faith who died on *this date*: *Bishop Martin of Tours in 397, and Soren Kierkegaard in 1855. Martin helped Christianity come to rural France, and Kierkegaard in his philosophical writings helped to introduce the Christian faith to the modern era.*

both the context and the geography of life in the Middle East. Included in this trip will be tours of Jerusalem and Bethlehem, celebrations of the Feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, and an excursion to Galilee.

Promotion for this trip, scheduled for April 29-May 13, 2008 has just begun. Total cost will be approximately \$3,000 (based on double occupancy), and space is limited.
