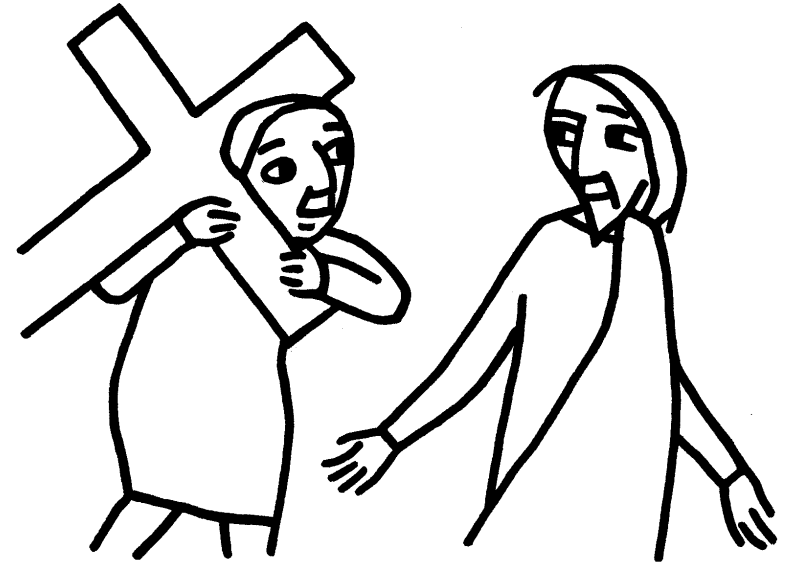

COMMEMORATIONS FOR THE WEEK

Tuesday, March 10, 2009

Harriet Tubman, died 1913; Sojourner Truth, died 1883; renewers of society

Harriet Tubman, born into slavery, helped about 300 others to escape slavery until the institution was abolished. Sojourner Truth, whose birth name was Isabella, was freed after slavery was abolished, and discerned a call to be a preacher. Taking the name Sojourner Truth, she set out on an evangelistic journey, where people found her testimony to be deeply moving.

Thursday, March 12

Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome, died 604

Born into wealth and power, Gregory was for a time the chief administrator of the city of Rome. Giving this up for a life in the church, he was elected pope in 590. He influenced public worship through the establishment of a lectionary and prayers to correlate with the readings. Gregorian chant is named in his honor.

During Lent we turn our eyes to Jesus, who promises liberation and healing.

We gather as a community to be strengthened for the journey ahead.

This includes a heightened austerity in our surroundings, including the veiling of crosses and religious images with purple cotton cloth or simple unbleached muslin, thus creating a Lent "fast for the eyes."

CTK will provide beverages and lunch, so please let us know if you will be participating this will help us in our planning efforts.

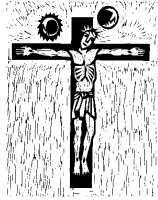
LSS NEED—1,000 Pillows!! Details about ingathering for NE Synod

Assembly & NED District Triennial: The LSS Services for New Americans tell us that's how many pillows they give away each year to newly arrived refugees! These individuals and families—from Iraq, Burundi, Burma, Somalia and many other countries—come here with nothing and need everything to set up housekeeping, beginning with bedding. In addition to pillows, they need blankets, comforters, sheet sets (full and single), and towels. These items are needed in LSS's residential youth and disability programs as well. **But if you would rather not haul these bulky items to the gathering, ask members of your congregations to contribute gift cards from walmart or target. LSS will use these to purchase basic household goods.**
