## COMMEMORATIONS FOR THE WEEK

*Sunday, May 24, 2009*

*Nicolaus Copernicus, died 1543; Leonhard Euler, died 1783; scientists*

These two men were both scientists who helped to explain the wonders of God's universe. Copernicus is best known for promoting the idea that the sun, not the earth, is at the center of our solar system. Euler was one of the founders of pure mathematics, and contributed to many other fields.

*Wednesday, May 27*

*John Calvin, renewer of the church, died 1564*

Gifted both as a systematic theologian and as an interpreter of scriptures, Calvin embraced the Reformation, and as a preacher in Geneva, Switzerland, brought a theocratic government to it. He is regarded as the father of the Reformed churches.

*Friday, May 29*

*Jiri Tranovsky, hymnwriter, died 1637*

Tranovsky is considered to be the father of Slovak hymnody as well as an important reformer of the Slavic church. He translated the Augsburg Confession (the basis of Lutheran teachings) and published a collection of Slovak hymns.

A warm pot of coffee is often the centerpiece of fellowship hour and other gatherings. Yet the small farmers who grow our coffee often struggle just to make a simple living. Many lack access to adequate housing, healthcare and education. Isolated from markets, they are forced to accept low prices. But there is an alternative: By paying a fair price, working with democratic cooperatives, offering affordable credit and supporting sustainable agriculture, Equal Exchange helps farmers to build better lives for themselves and their families.

Equal Exchange coffee, tea, chocolate, nuts, and more will be on sale in the breezeway on the first Sunday of every month. Funds raised from these sales also go to purchase the coffee we serve at our fellowship hour every Sunday, here at CtK.
