COMMEMORATIONS FOR THE WEEK

Sunday, July 12, 2009

Nathan Söderblom, Bishop of Uppsala, died 1931

A winner of the Nobel Prize for peace for his efforts to unite peoples after the First World War, Söderblom also called attention to the revival of early church worship principles, and helped to lay the groundwork for the World Council of Churches.

Friday, July 17

Bartolomé de Las Casas, missionary to the Indies, died 1566

A native of Spain, Las Casas first came to the Western hemisphere while serving in the military. Granted a large estate with indigenous slaves, he freed them after he was ordained a priest. He worked in the Caribbean and Central America to improve the lives of the native peoples.

THANK YOU CTK FOR STEPPING UP TO THE PLATE

Last Sunday CTK hosted Gary and Deb Winters, missionaries from Liberia, West Africa. We not only shared fellowship over a plate of food but we also saw what we have done jointly to help educate Liberian youth. In their own words, we heard how education is the key in the lives of Liberian Children and youth, for a more hopeful future. Then CTK members did step up to the plate again and committed to funding 27 new students in the Liberian Tuition Sponsorship Program. This number is added to the 36 students who are already receiving funding from CTK members. THANK YOU.

Tuition can cost as little as \$35 for primary school to \$150 for high school FOR THE WHOLE YEAR! All of the money goes directly to the school and secures a place for the student. There are no overhead costs, so what value for money!

But more than that, we are investing in the life of a country where our sisters and brothers from the Liberian Lutheran Church have led in peace and reconciliation ministries, after the 14 year long civil war. If you were not able to join us for brunch last Sunday, you may still view 2 inspiring videos of how the ELCA is accompanying the people of Liberia in rebuilding Curran Hospital and investing in the lives of Liberian school children. Ask Kay Edwards or Deirdra Schmidt about these videos.

There are 10 more students who are available for sponsorship and you can read their profiles at church on Sundays in July. Please see Kay Edwards who leads this ministry and hosted the Winters in her home last weekend. She can tell you more personal stories about their ministry in Liberia. Thanks to the CTK Global Mission Team for coordinating the brunch. So can we sponsor 10 more students and make it a clean sweep in the new season for Liberia?
